### **Programs for Trafficking Victims/At Risk Children**

The FFPSA includes a congregate care setting that provides high-quality residential care and support services to survivors of child sex trafficking or those at risk of becoming sex trafficking victims in its exception to the two-week federal payments rule. Discuss the particular needs of children who have experienced or are potential targets of sex trafficking, and how to ensure they are addressed in your programming.

### **Kinship Navigator Programs: Preparing to Meet Your Match**

Support for kinship families is a critical piece of the puzzle for child welfare. Under FFPSA, jurisdictions can receive ongoing federal reimbursement for up to 50% of their expenditures to provide kinship navigator programs that meet the evidence-based requirements of promising, supported or well-supported. Hear lessons learned from existing programs and strategies to help your organization prepare to develop an effective kinship navigator program.

### **Family-Based Residential Treatment for Substance Use Disorders**

A new light has been shined on the importance of family-based residential treatment programs through the passage of FFPSA. States now have the ability to receive federal Title IV-E foster care

maintenance reimbursement for children placed in family-based residential treatment programs with their parent(s). Hear from providers who have developed and implemented these specialized programs.
