Additional Provider Relief Funds Available



For any who missed the October 5 NACBH <u>News</u> <u>Flash</u>, HHS announced \$20 billion in Phase 3 Provider Relief funding and is accepting applications from eligible providers until November 6.

Brief recap: The Provider Relief Fund is rolling out in phases. Phase I was a general distribution to Medicare

fee-for-service providers. Phase 2 was a general distribution to Medicaid/CHIP providers, Medicaid managed care plans, dentists, certain Medicare providers, and assisted living facilities. In addition, there were targeted distributions for hospitals that were highly impacted by COVID-19, rural providers, skilled nursing facilities, tribal and Indian Health Service providers, and safety net hospitals, respectively. These targeted distributions were followed by a second application period for the Phase 2 general distribution, primarily for providers who had received a payment based only on their Medicare fee-for-service billing but were also Medicaid providers who hadn't yet received 2% of their overall annual patient care revenue. Provider Relief: Medicaid Directors Again Request Active Engagement with HHS

In late April, the National Association of Medicaid Directors (NAMD) wrote to HHS Secretary Alex Azar, requesting the department's immediate engagement with State Medicaid Directors to plan the distribution of supplemental funding to providers, as well as greater transparency on the amounts awarded to specific providers to inform state decisions on additional fiscal relief. NAMD pointed out that state Medicaid agencies have critical information about the solvency of providers at imminent risk of closure and the most effective means to distribute funding. NAMD highlighted particular provider categories whose claims data are not directly visible within federal data sources, such as behavioral health providers, home and community-based providers, children's hospitals, school-based providers, pediatricians, and maternal health providers. HHS Extends Public Health Emergency



On October 5, HHS Secretary Azar <u>renewed</u> the declaration of the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE) which would have expired on October 23. The 90-day renewal extends the PHE through January 20, 2021 (coincidentally, Inauguration Day). The previous two renewals, in April and July, provided only several days' advance

notice to states and providers delivering services under expanded PHE flexibilities.

As earlier <u>reported</u>, appendices to an August 25 MACPAC letter lay out the emergency response policies allowed by the PHE declaration, the Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, and the National Emergencies Act, as well as the Medicaid and CHIP flexibilities available to states under Section 1135 blanket waivers. <u>Continue Reading</u>

CMS and ACF Issue Joint Guidance on Family-Focused Residential SUD Treatment

As required by the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act, CMS and the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) have issued comprehensive guidance reviewing the existing flexibilities within Medicaid to provide family-focused residential treatment for substance use disorders, and how the IV-E foster care program can support placing children with their parents in these programs. The <u>Joint Informational Bulletin</u> reviews a variety of Medicaid state plan authorities, benefit categories, and waivers that states may use to cover parents' treatment, and how to coordinate Medicaid funding with IV-E and other federal funding to serve both parents and the children placed with them. <u>Keep Reading</u>
